

# *New Site Provides Resources*

The new Society Web site has many useful resources for members and chapters. For members who move and need to change address so publications are received, the form can be submitted by clicking Forms> Change of Address. Then click Submit and mission accomplished. The form even gives the member a chance to request information about chapters in her new area.

If you are a newsletter editor or even if you need a graphic for a display, there are several images, logos and graphics of official jewelry that can be found on the Web site under Library>Resources.

## **Music, Programs, Projects**

If you are looking for music for a chapter meeting, many songs are available on the site. Go to Library>Resources>Music. The music can be printed and used by members. It's easy as 1,2,3.

Chapters are always asking for program ideas. Several are available on the site. There are Founders' Day programs, fine arts program ideas, suggestions for projects and many other program ideas. All of these can be found under Library>Resources> Program Ideas.

## **Power Point Presentations, Past DKG Publications, Go To Meeting Info**

An archive center is available in the library. This can be found by clicking Library>Archive Center>DKG Stacks. Here you can find past issues of the *Bulletin*, *DKG News*, power point templates for international committees and past power point presentations. Past home pages of the DKG.org site can also be found in the archives center. More items are being added often so it is important to spend a few minutes and research new additions.

If your state organization has enrolled in the Go To Meeting Program offered by International, your chapter can utilize Go To Meeting for committee meetings. There is a brochure on the site explaining this program. This program allows committees to meet as often as needed via the computer. It is a great money-saving and time-saving convenience. ## **Schools for Africa Information**

The new International program Schools for Africa is featured on the site. This is an excellent tool to use in explaining the program to chapters as well as providing an explanation on what monies are needed to provide certain services. This information is found under Library>Resources>Schools for Africa.

Have you signed on to the DKG Network? Join the nearly 900 members who have. Click on the DKG Network in the right hand corner of the home page. This protected site gives members all the advantages of social media sites, yet information is private.
